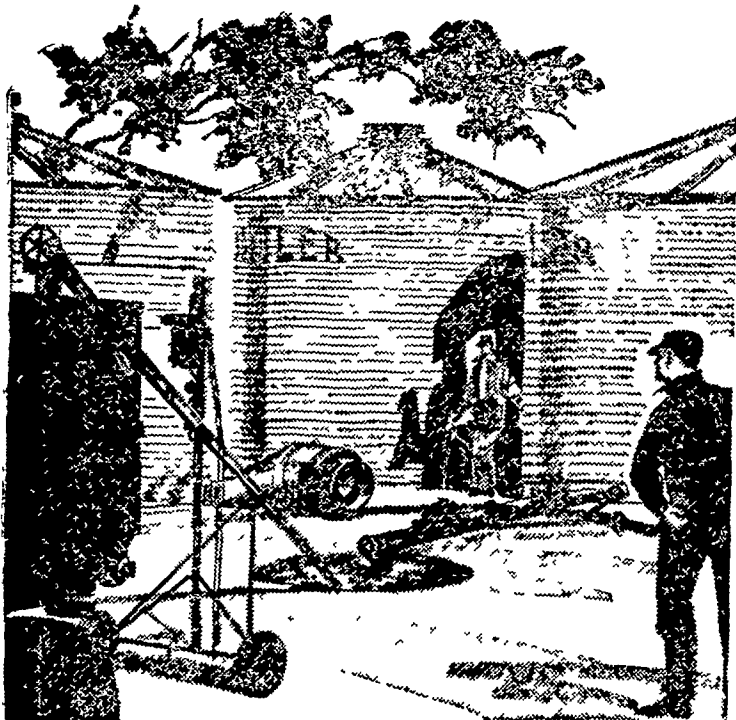

(Continued from Page 1) need for such accommodations, and demonstrates that the new headquarters gradually will assume a more substantial role as a center for the Commonwealth's whole agricultural program, the Secretary said.

In addition to strictly department use, meetings and conferences in the building, ranging in size from 10 to 200 persons, have averaged nearly one a day since the department took occupancy, he added.

Funds for the \$29 million, 4-story structure were authorized by the 1959 State Legislature. Ground was broken October 30, 1962 by Governor David L. Lawrence, and Governor Scranton officiated at the laying of the cornerstone December 11, 1963.

The next teachers' meeting was set for June 3 at Elizabethtown High School.
