**FLYING FARMERS SEE DUSTING DEMONSTRATION**

Flying Farmers from New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Maryland met at Elmira, N. Y., Saturday, May 8th. Honored guest was Don Schafer, Sterling, Kansas, President of International Flying Farmers. It was Schafer's first official visit to this area. He urged the members to oppose through letters to their congressmen the additional taxes proposed on aviation gasoline for general

aviation and to also express opposition to the implementation of a user's tax on aircraft and its radio equipment.

The group enjoyed a tour of the Schweizer Aircraft factory before the luncheon and Paul Schweizer, president, spoke to the group on their operations which include the production of the famous Schweizer sailplane. They also manufacture the Grumman Ag Cat agricultural plane.

Terrill Kuk, test pilot for Grumman also spoke about the Ag Cat and then later in the afternoon put on a dusting demonstration for the group.

L. L. Logan, Kennett Square Pa. Director of Region 1 presided at the meeting. He called attention to the newly appointed head of F. A. A. General William F. M. Kee being a military man, also the 2 1/2 million dollars asked by F. A. A. to put on an air show at Dulles Airport not being compatible with the claim of additional taxes being necessary for general aviation.

This was the fourth vocational judging championship for the Cloister Chapter this year. Their previous area wins were in the land meat and tractor driving contests.

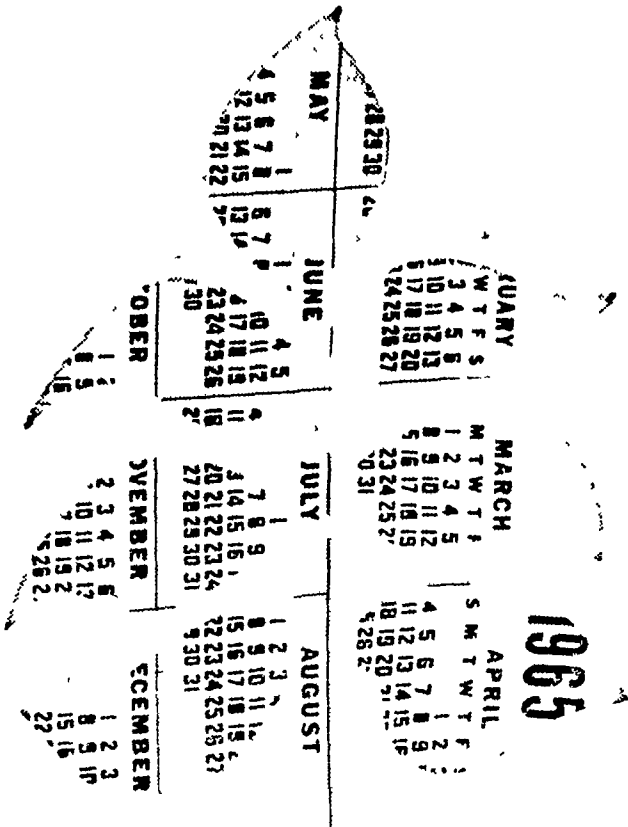
The contest was judged by Richard S. Willamee of Queen Dany, and included the following categories:

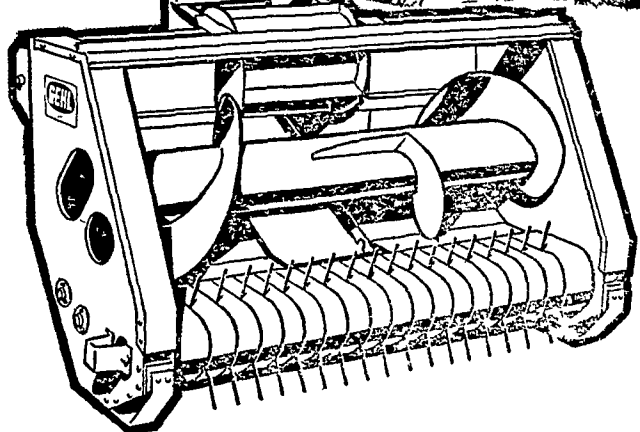
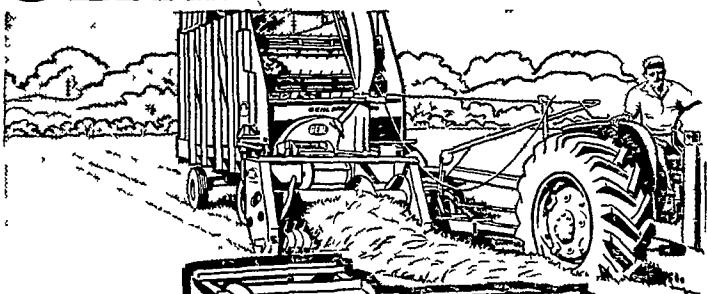

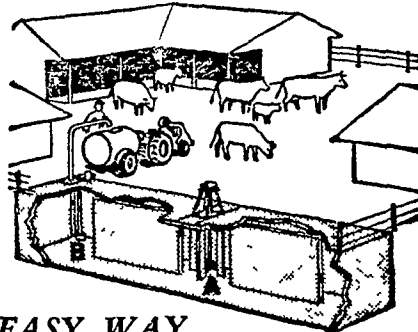
