The announcement of the purchase of an Ivanhoe son from Paul B Zimmerman Ephrata R1. was made this week by the Atlantic Breeders Cooperative, Lancaster.

Posch Sovereign Ivanhoe, classified Very Good at 88 points, is out of a Maplebend Dean King Posch daughter with records to 19,374 lbs of milk and 695 lbs of butterfat. A seven-eighths sister to Posch is classified Very Good and has a four-year old record of 18,927 lbs of milk and 664 lbs. of butterfat.

His maternal granddam is also Very Good at 98 points with 20,042 lbs of milk and 703 lbs of butterfat, and a maternal sister to his dam is Very Good with two records over 22,000 lbs of milk and 800 lbs of butterfat.

Agricultural Experiment Station field trials showed a high moisture content for alfalfa harvested at the early bud stage. Dr. Washko said This means that early cut alfalfa should be properly cured or be given a long wilting period if harvested for silage.

There is, he indicated, a slight drop in total dry matter yields per acre when alfalfa is harvested at early bud stage. The early maturing Dupuits variety lost 5 percent more dry matter yield than the later maturing Vernal alfalfa.
