At the hog sale on May 8, 165 head were received. Market hogs weighing 160-180 lbs. sold for 17.85-18.75; 180-200, 19.85-21.00; 200-220, 19.60-21.60; 220-240, 20.35-21.60; 240 and up, 18.50-20.50. Sows brought 15-15.60.

Prime 55-85 lbs. 28.50-33.50, Few 40-45 lbs. 23.00-24.00.

At the May 12 sale, 84 cows, 6 bulls, and 10 heifers sold slow to barely steady. Fresh Holsteins brought 250-610; Guerneys, 135-220; other breeds, 125-250. Bulls sold for 140-225; heifers 65-170.

Horse receipts totaled 966 at the May 10 sale, and sold steady. Mules brought 120-180; riding horses, 125-630; driving horses, 125-250; killers, 7-7½ cents per pound. Pony mares sold for 35-110, and geldings 25-115.

Hog receipts of 423 head sold generally at \$1 higher at the May 10 sale. Market hogs retailed at 22-22.75, few at 23; wholesale (U.S. 1-3), 21-22; heavyweights, 20-21. Sows brought 14.50-16.

At the May 10 sale, 56 calves sold at \$1 higher which about recovered last week's loss. Choice and Prime, 32-36; Good and Low Choice, 30.50-32, Standard, 29-30.50; Common, 20-25.

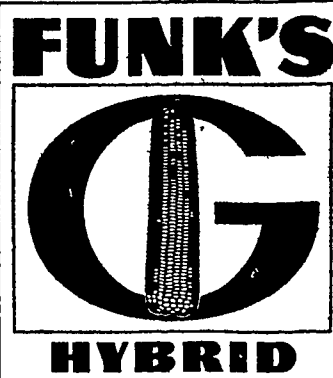
