(Continued from Page 1) the number of times and hour of day the rabbits enter and exit. Ground level weather stations will also be used to determine the relationship of weather to rabbit activities.

There is increasing evidence that rabbits are becoming more nocturnal. The reflective tags will be helpful in spotting the cottontails at night with lights.

The mortality phase of the investigation should disclose the effects of hunting and disease on rabbit populations.

"The decreasing numbers of rabbits being harvested by our hunters each year is of great concern to us," revealed Harvey A. Roberts, Chief of the Commission's Division of Research. "We suspect that cottontails are undergoing some behavior changes making them less available to the gun," added Roberts. "The study should give us these answers and help to better manage this important game species," he said.

The study areas will be in Union, Columbia, and York Counties.

The ribbon-cutting at the new plant on the Route 230 By-Pass was performed by William A. Billet, Broad Street, Emigsville, and Amos K. Rohrer, Columbia R2. Bil-

let, Pensupreme's oldest employee, was a milk routeman for thirty-eight years prior to his retirement in 1954. Rohrer, 91, is the dairy's oldest milk supplier. He first supplied milk to the company in 1918.

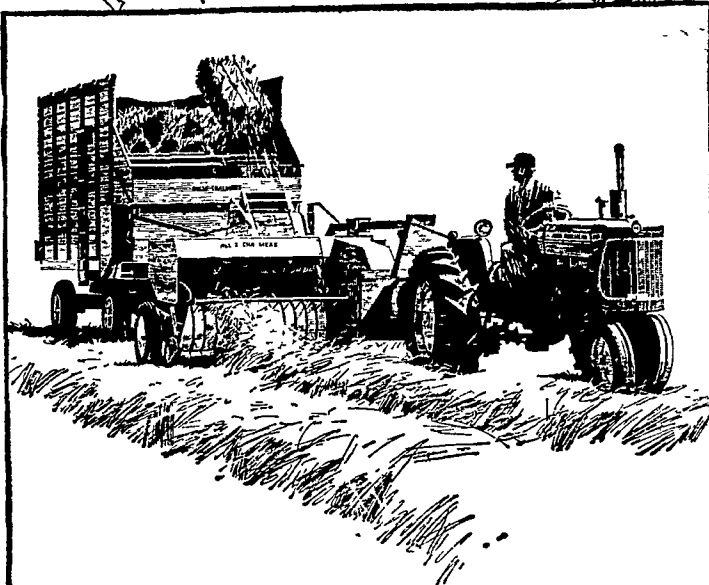
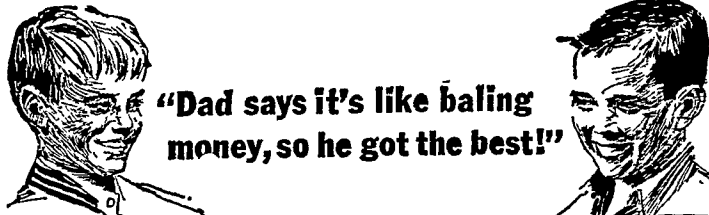
