There is increasing evidence that rabbits are becoming more nocturnal The reflective tags will be *b*clpful in spotting the cottontails at night with lights The mortality phase of the investigation should disclose the effects of hunting and disease on rabbit populations

"The decreasing numbers of being harve bbits sted by our hunters each year is of great concern to us," revealed Harvey A Roberts, Chief of the Commission's Division of Research "We suspect that cottontails are undergoing some behavior changes making them less available to the gun.' "The study added Roberts should give us these answers and help to better manage this important game species,' he said


