 The top cow at the sale on May 19 was a Citation daughter. The sale featured 40 head of pure Canadian cows, 24 of which averaged

\$485 per head. Total receipts were 161 cows, 6 bulls, and 8 heifers. Fresh Holsteins brought 250-900; Guernseys, 125-225; other breeds, 125-225. Bulls sold for 140-215; heifers, 85-160.

The horse sale on May 17 was slow to barely steady with 377 head offered. Riding horses brought 125-350; driving horses, 125-340; killers, 5 1/2 cents per pound. All mules went as killers. Pony mares sold for 35-110, and geldings 25-110.

Hogs gained again this week, averaging \$1 higher on the 478 head offered at the May 17 sale. Market hogs retailed for 23-23.50; wholesale (US 1-3), 22-23; heavy weights, 21-21.50. Sows brought 15 50-17 50. There were no shoats offered.

At the calf sale, 96 head sold steady on May 17. Choice brought 33-39; Good and Low Choice, 31-33, Standard, 29-31 Common, 22-27.

Weekly Review

Receipts 21,900 compared with 20,500 last week and 26,200 a year ago. Twelve market supply 170,700 compared with 170,800 a week ago and 190,500 a year ago.

Compared with last week, slaughter steers were uneven, closed steady to 25 higher. Heifers strong to mostly 25 higher. Cows were steady to 50 higher, largely 50 higher late. Bulls sold 25-75 higher. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer and heifer beef was
