the twelve-month laying period. An entry from Lennox, Iowa, was a close second with 272 eggs per bird.

The 300 Egg Club was started in January 1963 by the DeKalb company. Its purpose is to provide recognition for top egg producers, encourage accurate record keeping, and promote efficient egg production practices.

The 300-egg mark was chosen because the Association believed that today's better-bred birds have the genetic capability of achieving and surpassing the goal. They stress that sound management of the growing pullet and the layer are the keys to realizing this potential.

At the awards program, the members heard Penn State Extension Poultryman Dr. Floyd Hicks discuss the subject of profitable egg production. The day's activities concluded with a trip to the ball park to see the Senators play Detroit.

Is there enough water? Both faucets should be on; the hose free of kinks; and the lid or door closed.

Check the controls to see if they're set right, especially the reset button, if there is one.

If the washer has stopped during a cycle, the load may be unbalanced. Try distributing the clothes in the washer, pressing the reset button, and starting the machine.

Look at the instruction book that came with the washer. Read the directions to be sure you're following them exactly. Then, if you can't locate the trouble, call the serviceman. Have the model number with you when you make the call—the serviceman may ask for it
