nonfat solids. Whole milk, in contrast, has about 3.5 percent butterfat and 8.5 percent nonfat solids, the report points out.

Producers boost the nutritional value of low-fat milk by adding nonfat milk solids, usually in the form of non-fat dry milk powder. Often,

low-fat milk is fortified with Vitamins A and D.

Surveys in Milwaukee and New Orleans reveal that about half of the families using low-fat milk use it in place of whole, skim, or other forms of fluid milk. Most of the remaining families drink low-fat milk in addition to other forms of fluid milk.

Weight-watching is the chief reason consumers give

for drinking low-fat milk. Education and income are related to the use of low-fat milk, the study found. The better educated the family head, and the higher the nutritional value and because of its generally acceptable taste, the report says. low-fat milk

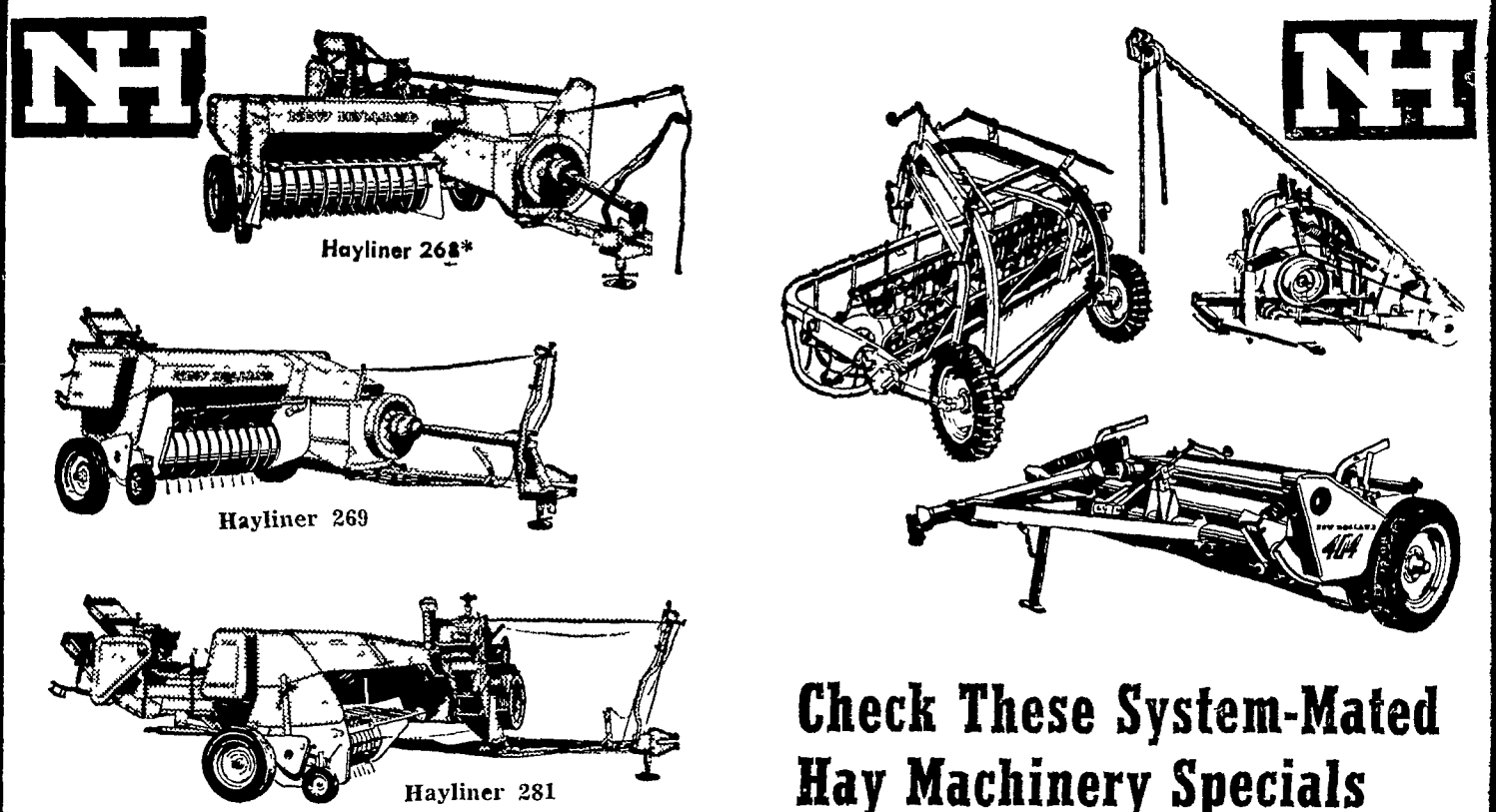
