

# Weekly Poultry Report

## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

### LIVE HENS

Prices on light type hens unchanged to 1/2c higher. Occasional unverified prices as high as 8c for floor birds were uncovered in Pa. Quotations at 6c reflect transactions on low volume pickups. Supplies no more than adequate for the mostly fair demand. Buying interest fair on heavy type hens. Supplies spotty, generally barely adequate. Prices paid at farms: light type hens 6-7 1/2 M 7c; heavy type 16-18 M 16c.

### Turkeys

Market generally inactive. Occasional flock of heavy type 14-15# hens moved at 31c with some bids at 32c unfilled.

### Delmarva

June 18, 1965

Delmarva market broiler and fryer live prices advanced nearly 1/4 cent. Demand was fairly good for light auction offerings.

Orders for next week were light though several features are planned for the week of June 28. Delivered prices were generally 1/2 cent lower, and very competitive.

Estimated slaughter for this weekend was 882,000 head compared to 770,000 head last weekend.

In the 24-hour preceding market close on Friday, broiler and fryer live prices ranged from 15.2 to 16.9 cents per pound.

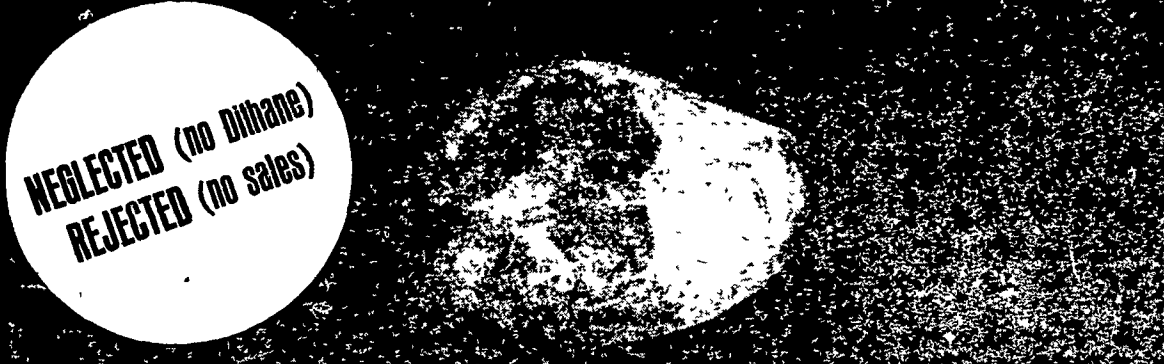
