REPLACEMENT HATCHINGS DOWN 29 PERCENT

Production of egg-type chicks in Pennsylvania totaled 2,554,000 during June, 18 percent below a year earlier, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service The cumulative hatch for the first 6 months of 1965 was 29 percent below the corresponding period in 1964

The combined total of egg-type and broiler-type chick hatch during June was 7,368,000, 6 percent below May but 4 percent above June 1964

 Receipts totaled 368 head at Monday's sale and these sold steady. Riding horses brought 125-300; driving horses, 125-350; killers (including all mules), 5-5½ cents per lb. Pony mares brought 30-100; geldings 25-115.

HOGS July 19, 1965
 Hogs continued steady with receipts totaling 428 head. For the second consecutive week a few shoats were available — only 21 head, and they went for 14.50-15.50. Market hogs retailed for 26-26.75; heavyweights, 24-25; wholesale (U.S. 1-3), 25.35-26. No sows were reported.

CALVES July 19, 1965
 Calves partially regained some of the loss in recent weeks selling at steady to \$1 higher this week. Choice and Prime brought 30-32.50; Good and low Choice, 28-30; Standard 26-28; Common, 18-25.50

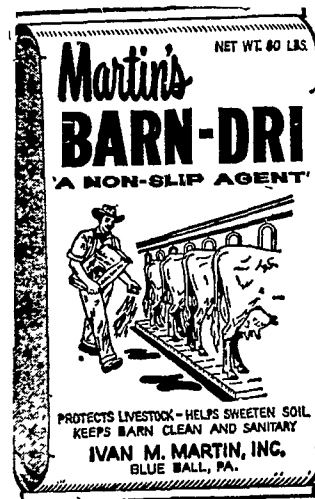
