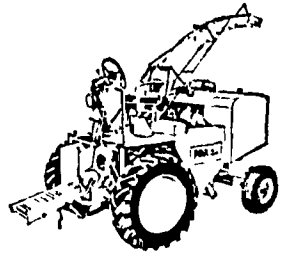
The Kookie Kooks work meetings will be held every Wednesday from 13 pm at the Penn Manor High School.
