The feature of Wednesday's sale was two loads of purebred Canadian cows, twenty of which sold for an average of \$482 Receipts totaled 197 cows, 3 bulls, and 3 heifers. Fresh Holsteins brought 275-700; Guernseys, 150-250; other breeds, 150-275. Bulls sold for 140-210, and heifers 65-140.

The 137 head offered sold steady with Choice and Prime bringing 30-32.50; Good and Low Choice, 28-30; Standard, 26-28; Common, 18-25.50.

CATTLE — Receipts 20,700 compared with 22,850 last week and 22,300 a year ago. Twelve market receipts 178,700 compared with 184,300 last week and 199,700 a year ago. Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers and heifers 25-75 higher. Cows and bulls generally steady. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef steady to 1.50 higher, most advance on Choice 700-900 lbs. heifer beef 50-1.00 higher. Cow beef 50-1.50 lower.
