Prices were unchanged to 1/4c higher on light type hens. Supplies remain limited in New Jersey but increasing in Pa. as producers make way for pullet flocks. Demand ranged fair to good. Occasional lots for recycling purchased at 8-8 1/2c. Offerings of heavy type hens slightly increased & generally adequate for a light demand. A few lots purchased at 15 1/2c for pick up next week. Prices paid at farms: Light Type hens 6 1/2-8, mostly 7-7 1/4; Heavy Type hens too few to report.

Eastern Shore Exchange

Broilers and fryers live prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange this week averaged 16.09 cents per pound, up .03 cent from the preceding week. This figure is based on the daily lot averages Monday through Thursday. Prices paid ranged from a low of 15.4 on Wednesday to a high of 16.8 cents on Tuesday. Sales for the week totaled 1,785,300 head, down 124,600 head from last week's sales.

Delmarva

Delmarva broiler and fryer live prices advanced about 1/2 cent with demand fair for light auction offering on Friday.

Ready-to-cook demand was also fair but lacked aggressive ness.

Estimated slaughter for this weekend was 856,000 head compared to 890,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, broilers and fryers live prices ranged from 15.7-16.6 cents per lb. on sales of 1,014,500 head.

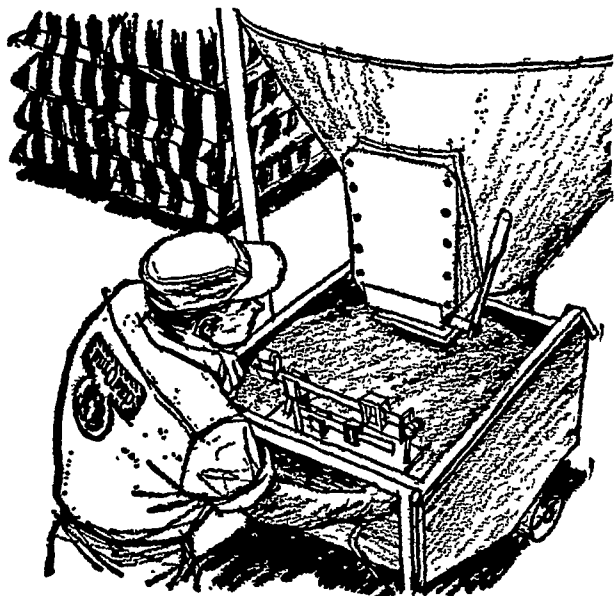

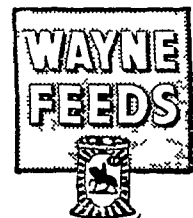
