

Weekly Poultry Report

Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey WEEKLY SUMMARY

LIVE HENS

Prices were unchanged on light type hens. Undertone steady to firm. A good demand easily cleared available local offerings. In instances supplies were secured from outside areas to fill needs. Trading limited on heavy type. Supplies were generally sufficient. Prices paid at farms: Light type hens 6½-8, mostly 7-7½c; heavy type hens 15-16, mostly 16c.

TURKEYS

A few small lots of heavy type hens purchased at 25c. Supplies adequate.

Eastern Shore Exchange

Broilers and fryers live prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange averaged 16.48 cents per pound this week, up .39 cent from the preceed-

ing week.

Prices paid ranged from a low of 16.2 on Tuesday to a high of 16.6 cents on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Sales for the week totaled 1,882,100 head, up 96,800 head from last week's sales.

Delmarva

August 6, 1965

Delmarva live broiler and fryer prices were mostly unchanged. Live supplies were adequate on 3½-4 lb. sizes, but short on weights of 4-4½ lbs.

Ready-to-cook demand was fair, with plant offerings barely adequate.

Estimated slaughter for this weekend was 842,500 head, down 13,500 head from last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, broilers and fryers live prices ranged from 16.0-17.1 cents per lb. on sales of 1,196,500 head.

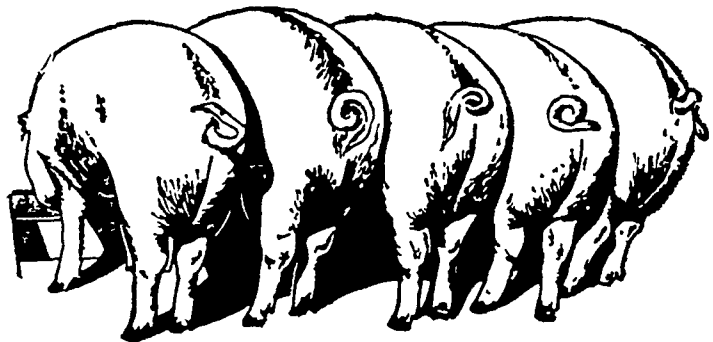

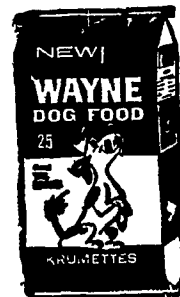
