plained that the agency receives numerous complaints alleging that buyers failed to pay for meat in accordance with purchase contracts, or refused—without justification—to accept delivery.

Most of these complaints, the P&S Division said, concern grade, weight, condition, shipping instructions, or time of arrival.

In administering the P&S Act, C&MS is called into these contract disputes to ascertain whether the P&S Act has been violated. The new proposal outlining the P&S Division's policy under the Act is intended to serve as a guide to the industry in such matters.

The proposed policy statement points out that all terms of a transaction should be made clear in the contract, whether it is written or verbal. If there is any chance of misunderstanding, a written confirmation should be exchanged between the parties.

When contract disputes cannot be settled between the parties, and either party in-

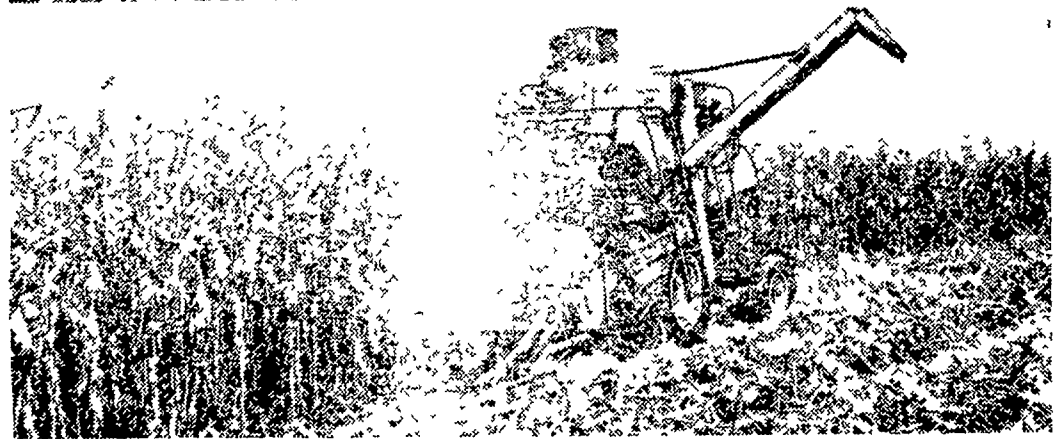
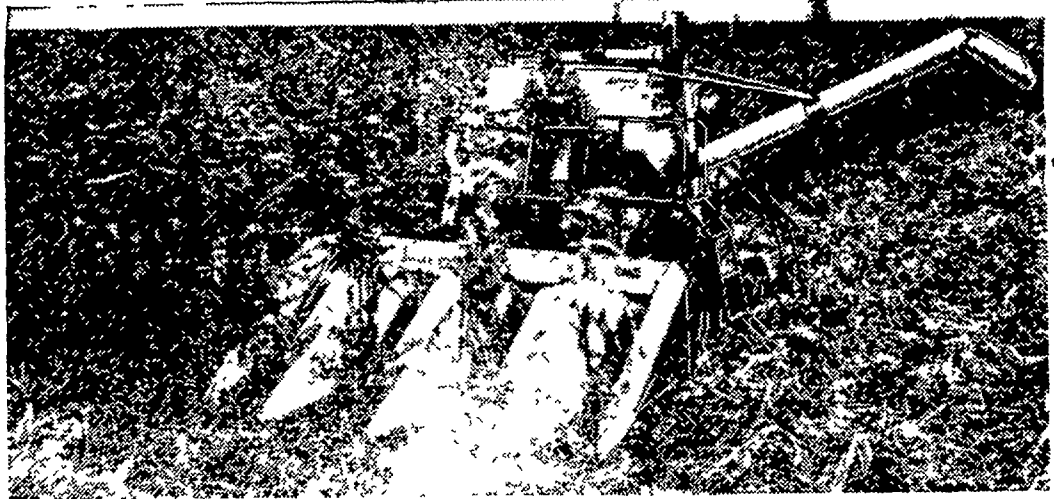
