LIVE HENS

Prices on light type hens unchanged to 1/4c higher. Offerings barely adequate & in instances consisted of flocks being moved to make space for young pullets. Demand fair. Few lots heavy type hens moved on undetermined price basis with settlement prices based on ready to cook valuations. Offerings light for a limited demand.

TURKEYS

Dull increased offerings heavy type hens & toms anticipated within next several weeks. Too few negotiations to report prices.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

Broilers and fryers live prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange averaged 16.49 cents per lb. this week, down .05-

cent from the preceding week's average.

Prices paid ranged from a high of 17.3 cents on Monday and Tuesday to a low of 15.9 cents on Wednesday.

Sales for the week totaled 1,413,400 head, nearly 200,000 head more than last week.

Delmarva

Sept. 3, 1965

Delmarva live broiler and fryer prices remained comparatively steady with a fair demand for light auction offerings. Live supplies were adequate with sizes improved and generally within desired ranges.

Ready-to-cook demand ranged fair to good though lacked aggressiveness. Prices continued very competitive.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 898,000 head, compared to 949,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, broilers and fryers live prices ranged from 16.0-16.8 cents per lb. on sales of 1,040,600 head.

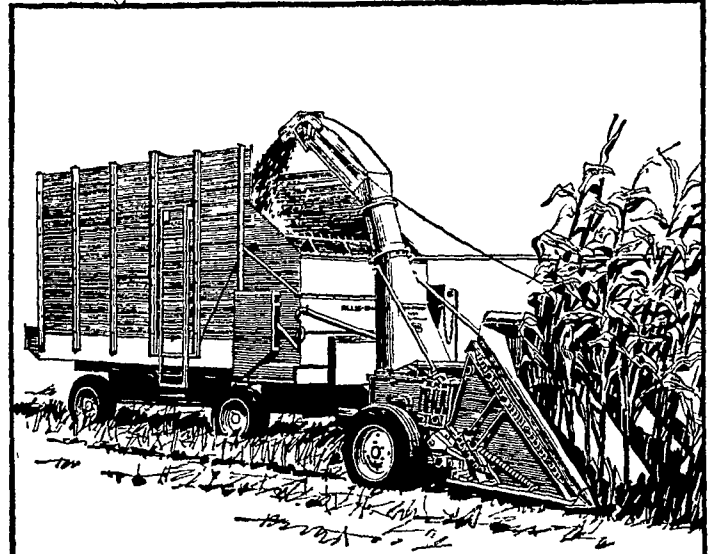
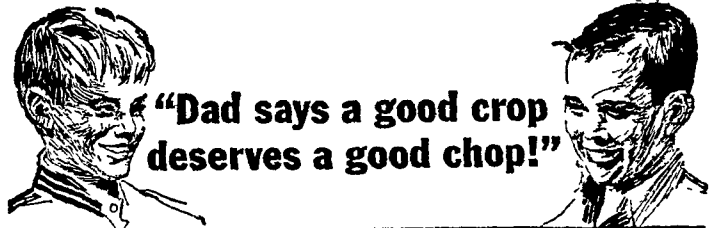
