land treatment, flood prevention dams, channel improvement and other structural measures primarily for flood prevention and agricultural water management, but local sponsors may include municipal and industrial water supply by paying additional cost. Additional cost of the extra storage in the 88 reservoirs is estimated to be \$23,500,000.

As of Aug. 1, USDA had received 2,335 applications from local sponsors for assistance on watershed projects in 49 States and Puerto Rico. The Soil Conservation Service had been authorized to give planning assistance on 1,125 projects. Of this number plans had been completed and assistance in the installation of improvements had been approved for 642.

rector of Pennsylvania Farm Bureau Cooperative Association in 1958 and continued on the Agway board following the merger of Agway and PFBCA earlier this year.
