

Some Hints for Easy Sandwich Preparation

When preparing sandwiches for three or more persons at one time, these tips can help make the job go faster.

Soften butter or margarine.

Place neighboring slices of bread in an even number of rows on a bread board or table_top.

Use a flexible spatula for spreading a coating of softened butter or margarine to the edges of each slice of bread.

Put filling on half the slices and then top with neighboring slices.

Stack two or three sandwiches, and cut them all at once with a large sharp knife. Vary the shapes of sandwiches occasionally.
