cream. Stir in coconut, nuts and cereal. Spread topping over warm cake. Place about 3 inches from hot broiler unit until mixture browns, about 2 minutes. Makes enough to top one 13x9-inch cake or two 8-inch or 9-inch square or round layers.

ORANGE MACARON CREME

- 12 coconut macaroons
- 6 oranges, peeled, cut into bite-size pieces
- 2 cups sliced fresh strawberries (or frozen and thawed)
- ½ cup light brown sugar
- 2 cups dairy sour cream

Crumble 6 coconut macaroons in bottom of an attractive glass serving bowl. Add half the orange pieces and sliced strawberries. Cover with half the brown sugar and sour cream. Crumble remaining macaroons over all and add remaining oranges, strawberries and brown sugar. Spread the remaining sour cream in a smooth layer over the top. Chill at least two hours or until very cold. 6 to 8 servings.

verified farm with an additional 8 acres of rented land. The main farm program is swine and the herd consists of 44 sows, 25 gilts, 3 boars, and about 250 fattening pigs. The only other livestock on the farm is about 25 head of steers which are fattened twice a year. Most of the farm, about 44 acres, is in corn, but the Eby's also raise 2 acres of celery and 6 acres of vegetables.

Although John has never held a state FFA office, he has served as secretary of the county chapter, and as president and chaplain of his local chapter.

John has also been active in 4-H work, first with baby beef and then branching into his main farming interest, hogs.

MELVIN BRENEMAN

Melvin is a 1962 graduate of Lampeter - Strasburg High School, and is the 20-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. C. Henry Breneman. He presently operates the 130-acre home farm in partnership with his father and with his younger brother, Larry, who is a senior at Lampeter-Strasburg.

The main farm enterprise is dairy and the only crops grown on the farm are feed for the 75-head of milking Guernseys and 30 head of young stock. The family farms 50 acres of corn and 50 acres of alfalfa, with most of the latter going into the silo in

the form of haylage.

Melvin served as chaplain in the state FFA association in 1963-64, and has held the offices of sentinel and chaplain in the local Garden Spot Chapter. He received the highest state FFA award in 1962, the Keystone Degree. He also has a history of 4-H activity. He is a past president of the county Guernsey club, and now serves that club as a junior leader.

His plans for the future are closely tied to farming, but he also hopes that at the right time he may be able to further his formal education.

Area Guernseys Make Records

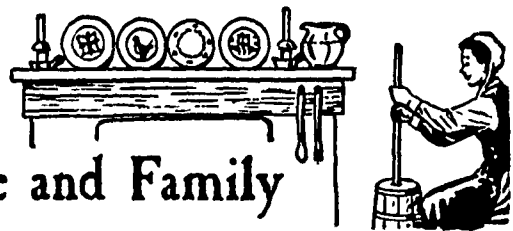
Registered cows in herds of two area Guernsey breeders recently completed official production records according to the American Guernsey Cattle Club.

Two of these were in the herd of J. Rohrer Witmer, Willow Street: Lee Kra Farms S Emily, a Jr. 7-year-old, produced 11,910 lbs. of milk and 624 of butterfat; Ludlow Beautys Golda, a Jr. 8-year-old, had 11,710 lbs of milk and 577 of butterfat.

A Jr. 3-year-old, Meetinghouse Lane Fame Felice, owned by H. H. McConnell of Honey Brook, produced 11,580 lbs milk and 537 of butterfat.

All records were under the DHER testing program, and were for a period of 305 days.

Ladies, Have You Heard? . . .

Some Hints for Easy Sandwich Preparation

When preparing sandwiches for three or more persons at one time, these tips can help make the job go faster.

Soften butter or margarine. Place neighboring slices of bread in an even number of rows on a bread board or table top.

Use a flexible spatula for spreading a coating of softened butter or margarine to the edges of each slice of bread.

Put filling on half the slices and then top with neighboring slices.

Stack two or three sandwiches, and cut them all at once with a large sharp knife. Vary the shapes of sandwiches occasionally.

Wrap each sandwich separately, then label each kind for sure and easy packing.
