Sales for the week totaled 991,500 head, down 92,700 head from the preceding week's total.

In the 24-hours preceding market close on Friday, live broiler and fryer prices ranged from 13.9-15.2 cents per lb. on sales of 785,700 head.

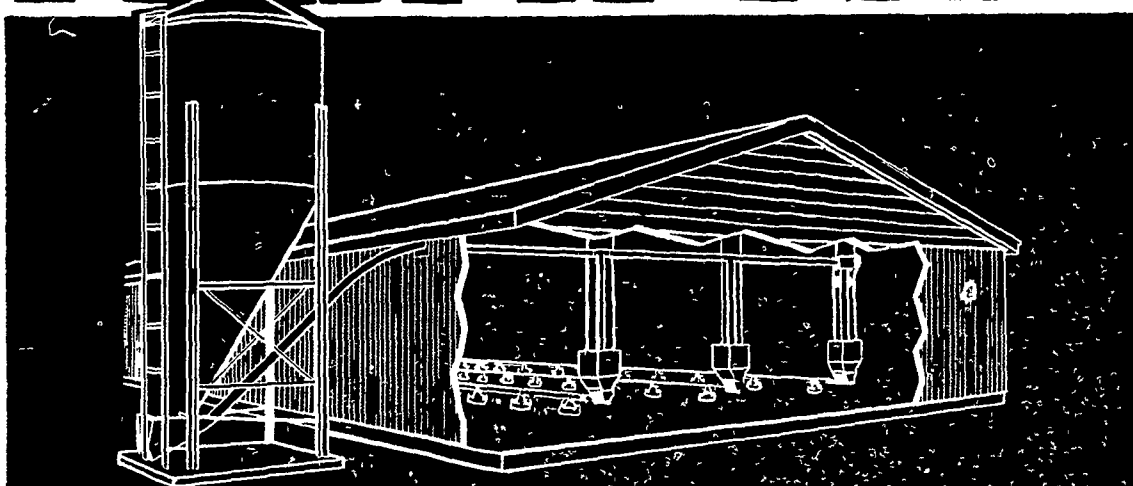
