STEER SHOW

The grand champion steer in the Solanco Fair baby beef show was owned by Fred Linton, Jr., of Quarryville R2, and shown by Kenneth Rutt,

also of Quarryville R2.

The blocky, 1000 pound Hereford, called "Rocky" because he was bred in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado, was picked by judge Tony Dobrowsky over 35 other 4-H and FFA animals.

For the reserve title, the York County associate agricultural agent went to a 775-pound Angus named "Bo Bo" which was shown by Kathy Weaver of Quarryville R2. Kathy is the 15-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jason Weaver.

With the exception of Linton's Hereford, all of the titles went to Angus entries. The FFA winners were Roy Anderson of Oxford R2, champion, and Bill Hollinger of Quarryville R1, reserve. The 4-H winners were Fred Linton, Jr., and Kathy Weaver, champion and reserve, respectively.

Showmanship honors went to Kathy Weaver on a close win over Bill Hollinger, but in the fitting contest Hollinger took the first and second spots with the two animals he had shown — a 4-H Hereford and an FFA Angus.

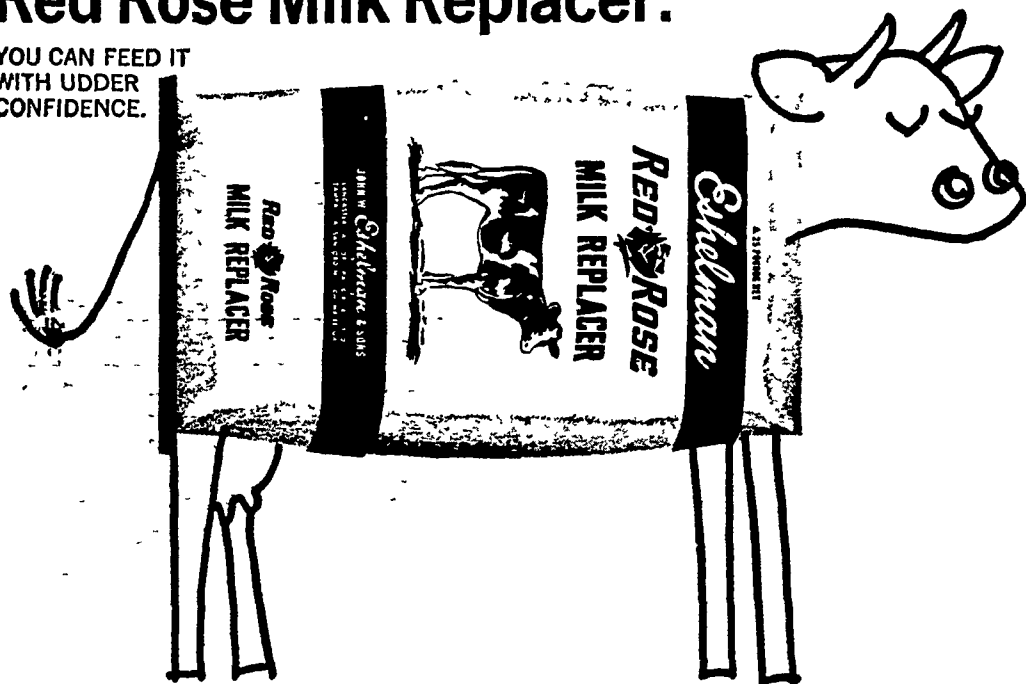

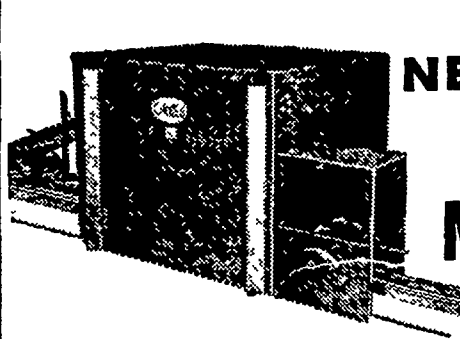
