Comis officials said the and maturity regulations for potato importa, effective October 1, 1965, as follows:

Round white varieties will be limited to U. S. No. 2 or better grade, 17s inches minimann diameter. The U.S. No. 2 grade cannot be more than "moderately skinned" and all other grades cannot be more than "slightly skinned."

Round red varieties must meet the same grade, and maturity requirements as round white imports, except they must be at least 21/2 inches in diameter, and the maturity requirements will be effective only through Oct. 16.

Long Varieties will have to be U. S. No. 2 or better grade, 2 inches minimum diameter or 4 ounces minimum weight, not more than "slightly skinned," and at least 90 per-cent "fairly clean," except White Rose variety potatoes may be imported if not more than "moderately skinned."
