Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 898,000 head, compared to 813,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, prices ranged from 14 3/4 to 15.7 cents per lb.

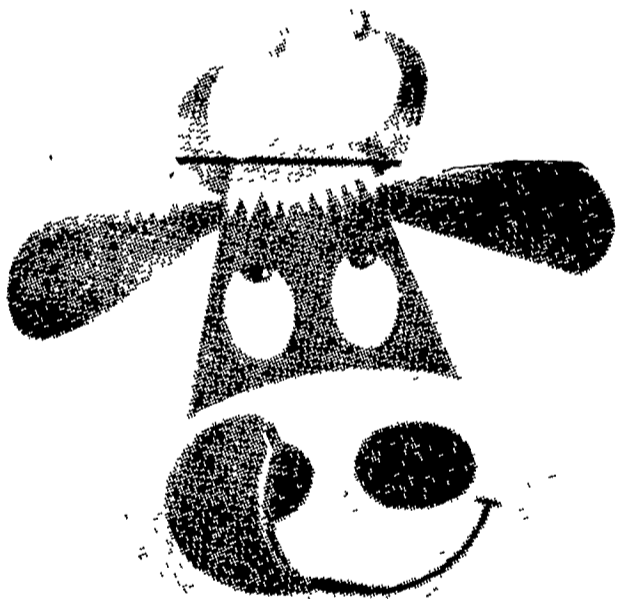

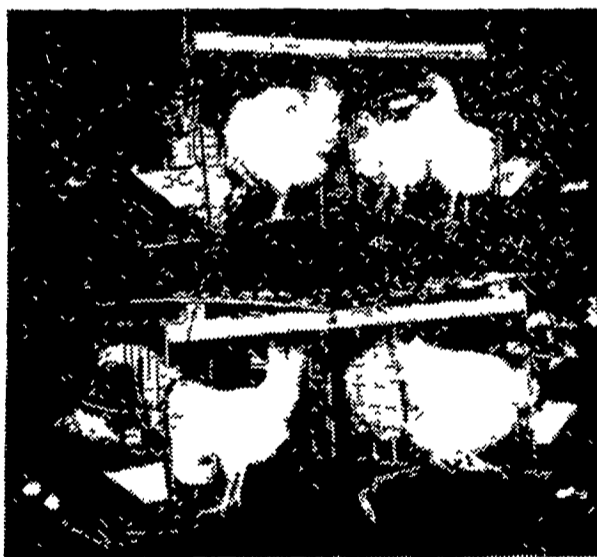
