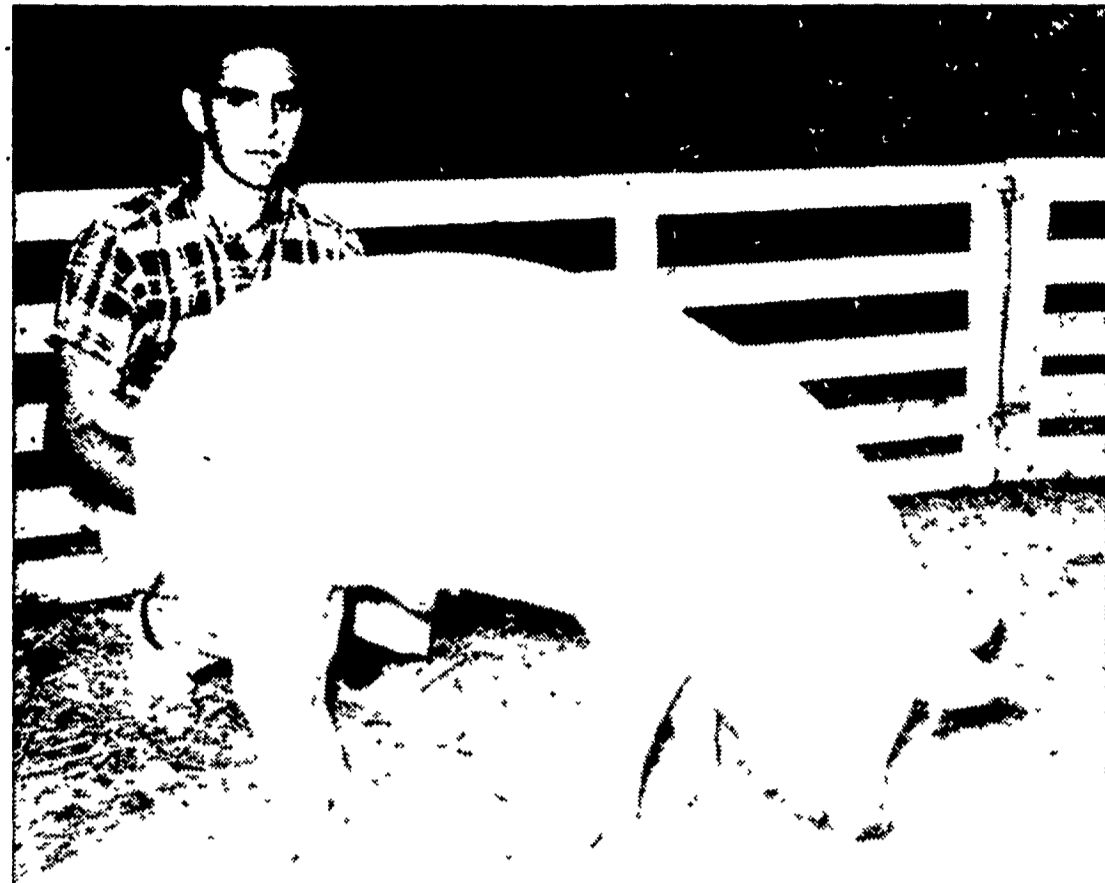

Hay, Tobacco & Corn Winners At N. H. Fair

Hay championships at the New Holland Farmers Fair were won Wednesday by Galen Crouse, Stevens R1, for his heat-cured entry; and by Glenn D Yost of Narvon R2 for his field-dried exhibit.

Crouse, a three-time-winner

of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Hay Show, also is a former winner of the New Holland hay title

Judging the hay exhibits was John Baylor, extension agronomist of Penn State University

Roy Bowman of New Holland R1 swept the fair's tobacco show, winning both wrapper and filler divisions.

Beam won the single ear competition for hybrid or open pollinated dent varieties. Yost took the 10 ear division, with Brubaker the 30 ear display

Larry Weaver's Crossbred, Pig Show Champion

A crossbred shown by Larry Weaver, New Holland R1, took the grand championship in the 4-H pig show at the New Holland Farmers Fair on Thursday. Larry is the 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lester M Weaver.

The 215-pound barrow was bred by Masonic Homes Farm, Elizabethtown, and was a three-way cross of Landrace-Duroc-Yorkshire breeds.

Reserve honors went to Robert Fisher, 17-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Fisher of East Earl R1. His entry was also a crossbred.

In the special classes the two Fisher boys, Robert and William, traded first and second positions with Bob on top in the showmanship event, and Bill taking the fitting class.

The fourteen hogs entered by seven club members were sold at auction on Friday afternoon.

The 4-H Pig Club is sponsored by the New Holland Rotary Club. The show was judged by Dauphin County farm agent Harold Stewart. Show results.

County Judging Team Places 2nd At Atlantic

The Lancaster County 4-H Livestock Judging team failed in a bid to defend its title this week at the Atlantic Rural Exposition at Richmond, Virginia.

The state champion judging squad competed without one of its members in the event. Kenneth Hess, Strasburg R1, the fourth member of the team was unable to attend the meet because of classes at Penn State University, where he is a freshman.

David Heisey of Newmans-town led the local club on points with 520, which rated as fourth high individual score among the participants. Michael Hosler, Marheim R3, was close behind with 516 points, followed by Fred Hess, Leola R1, with 504.

The team finished the competition in second place, behind the Virginia squad. Virginia's team score was 1563 to Lancaster's 1540 points.

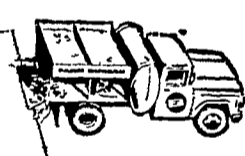
