Judging the limited-sized sheep show was Fred Thomas, assistant county agent of Fulton County

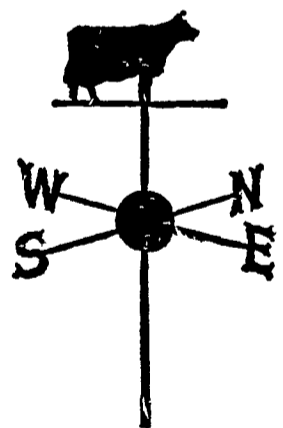
