## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

### WEEKLY SUMMARY

#### LIVE HENS

Prices on light type hens unchanged. Demand good. Offerings adequate in N.J., but ample in Pa. Active movement noted from New York State to New Jersey processors. In occasional instances of prices over 8c, some flocks being regarded & separated for additional egg production. Trading on heavy type hens light with moderate supplemental supplies being brought in from New England sections. Prices paid at farms: light type hens 7-8½ mostly 8c; heavy type hens 15c.

#### TURKEYS

Demand light. Offerings ample. Most movement consists of intra-company flocks or prior committed transactions. Occasional lots of heavy type hens sold at 23½-24c; heavy type toms too few to report.

Broilers and fryers live prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange averaged 16 04 cents per lb. this week, up ½-cent from last week's average

Prices paid ranged from a low of 15 2 cents on Monday to a high of 16 9 cents on Thursday

Sales for the week of 1,054, 500 head were off about 100,000 head from last week's total sales.

## Delmarva

October 15, 1965

Delmarva broiler and fryer prices declined nearly ¼-cent. Demand only fair for light auction offerings. Live supplies adequate though ranging slightly heavier than desired in instances.

Ready-to-cook demand ranged slow to fair, but lacked aggressiveness as dealers resisted higher price levels.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 837,000 head, compared to 908,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, broiler prices ranged from 15.5-16.9 cents per lb. on sales of 793,800 head.

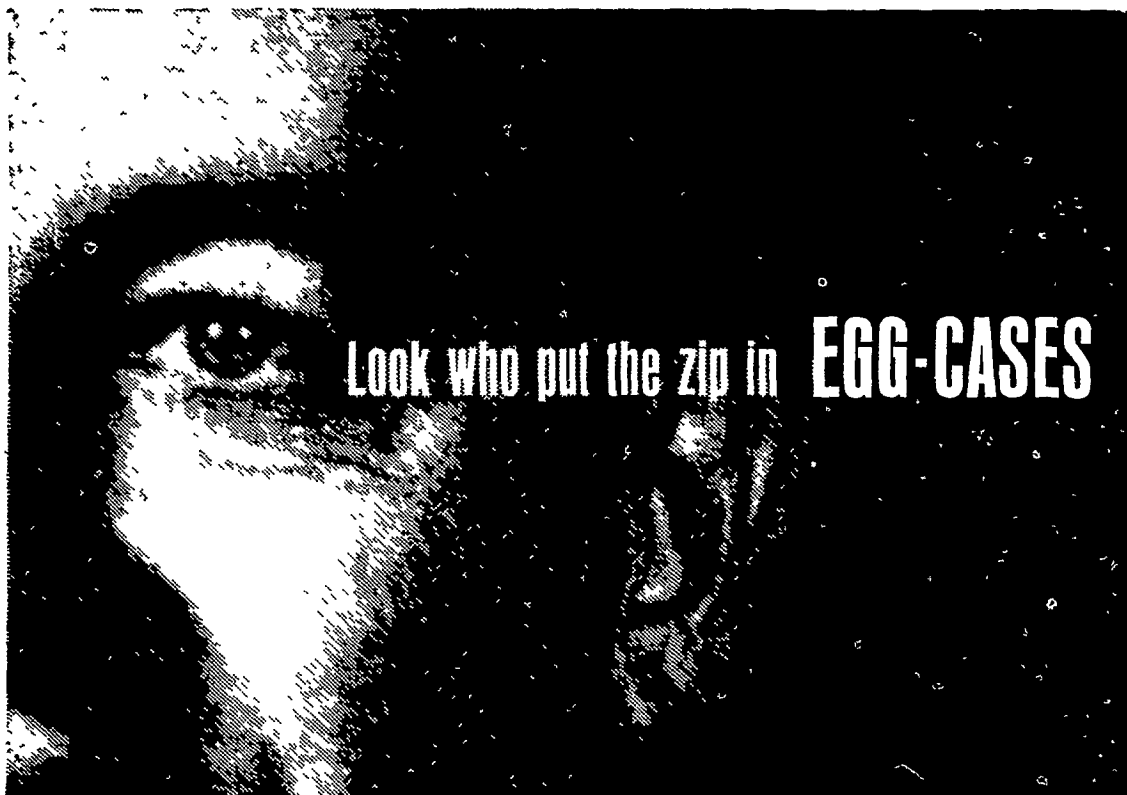

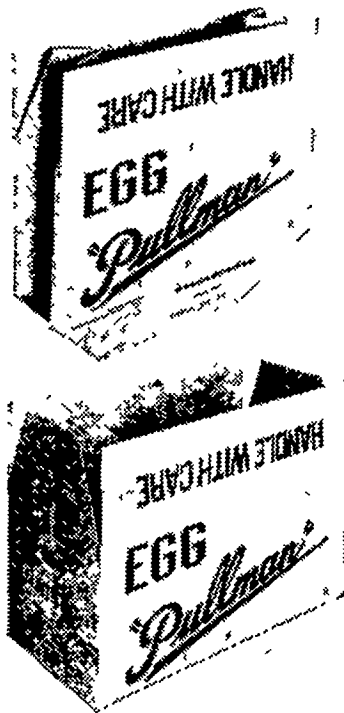
