Packing Plant at Souderton. The Move: Dehydrating Plant where 120 tons of poultry feathers and 12 tons of poultry litter are processed daily will also be seen.

The farm of Omar Beam at Elverson R1 will be the first stop following lunch. Beam has a 30-sow farrowing house and raises 200 beef calves. Final stop will be at the Dairy Manor Farms at Coopersville R1 where 1400 steers are fed automatically.

Advance reservations are requested for the bus and lunch arrangements. The buses will load up at the Lancaster Shopping Center at 7 a.m. with tickets available for the bus ride at \$3 per person at that time.
