LIVE HENS

Prices on light type hens mostly 1/2c higher. Offerings barely adequate for a good buying interest. Demand for heavy type hens fair. Supplies increased slightly & adequate. Prices paid @ farms: Light type hens 7 1/2-9 mostly 8-8 3/4c; heavy type hens 15-15 1/2 mostly 15c.

TURKEYS

Demand fair on all classes. Offerings fully adequate on hens, ample on toms, and very light on small type breeds and fryer/roasters, prices at 24-25c on hens reflect negotiations for movement within the next three weeks. Prices paid at farms: Small Type 10-12# Hens 30c; Heavy Type Hens 24-25c; Heavy Type Toms 21 1/2c.

Eastern Shore Exchange WEEKLY SUMMARY

Broilers and fryers live prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange averaged 16.91 cents per lb. this week, an advance of nearly 1 cent from last week's average.

Prices ranged from a low of 16.0 cents on Monday to a high of 17.6 cents on Thursday.

Sales for the week totaled 975,000 head, a decrease of nearly 50,000 head from the preceding week.

Delmarva

November 5, 1965

Delmarva broiler and fryer live prices advanced more than 1/4-cent with good demand for light auction offerings. Weights were well distributed, supplies continued barely adequate, and prices have been stronger each day this week.

Ready-to-cook demand fair to good. Most plants continue near capacity. Prices unchanged to slightly stronger.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 873,000 head, compared to 903,000 head last weekend.

In the 24-hour period preceding market close on Friday, live broiler, on farm prices ranged from 16.5-17.6 cents per lb. on sales of 945,000 head.

Approximately 50,000 Pennsylvanians are presently working in Civil Service positions. Nearly 25,000 are employed in the Department of Public Welfare, about 5,500 in the Department of Labor and Industry, 4800 in the Liquor Control Board, and more than 2800 in the Health Department. The remaining 12,000 are employed in 24 other State agencies.
