(Continued from Page 1) service area in which Lancaster County is included. The scholarships are made available at 21 service area colleges and universities.

Busby emphasized that "today, more than ever, the nation needs college-trained young people to provide the leadership and creativity so vital to building a continually better society. Recognizing that cost is often a substantial deterrent to many qualified young people seeking a college education, PP&L offers these scholarships under its broad program of aid to higher education."

The utility executive explained that PP&L shareowners have granted authority to the directors of the Company to make reasonable expenditures for aid to education and for the support of worthwhile civic and charitable activities. These contributions are made from the earnings available to pay shareowners a return on their investments and in no way affect the price of electric service to customers, he said.

Materials explaining the program are available at high schools in the area. A brochure outlining program details can be obtained from high school principals or guidance counselors, or by contacting the nearest PP&L office.

COLLEGES DETERMINE WINNERS

The college to which an applicant applies has the sole responsibility for determining the scholarship winners. Therefore, an applicant will be eligible to compete for a scholarship only if he or she has applied to and been ad-

mitted by one of the colleges participating in PP&L's program. A high school senior may apply to more than one college for a PP&L scholarship.

In awarding a scholarship, the respective colleges will consider scholastic ability and financial need, and any other criteria customarily examined.

Since 1947, when PP&L's first scholarship program was initiated, the Company has been able to assist a total of 196 deserving young people in their search for a higher education.

PP&L's aid to education exceeded \$125,000 last year, which includes scholarship assistance, contributions to independent colleges and college expansion activities and matching employee contributions to alumni funds and foundations.

Services of Land-Grant Colleges and Universities, and representatives of farm organizations and businesses interested in prospects in agriculture will attend. The sessions are open to the public.

The Economic Research Service, USDA, which publishes a number of agricultural outlook and situation reports throughout the year, will coordinate the meetings.

Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman is scheduled to address the Conference on Monday morning, Nov. 15.

Specialists from USDA Agencies—Economic Research, Federal Extension, Foreign Agricultural, Forest, and Agricultural Research Services, and the Farmers Home Administration — will address the Conference or take part in panel discussions. Joining them will be specialists from other Government Departments — State, Labor Commerce, Health Education and Welfare, and from the National Bureau of Standards. Representatives of State Universities and industry will also participate.

General sessions will be held all day Monday, Nov. 15, and Tuesday morning in Jefferson Auditorium, USDA's South Building. The commodity sessions will begin Tuesday afternoon and continue through Thursday noon—some in the South Building, some in the Freer Gallery of Art. When Sewing With Dacron Polyester-Cotton Fabric

It's easy to sew with Dacron polyester-cotton fabrics, and you'll get a professional looking garment if you observe a few special tips.

Use fine pins with sharp points — they won't puncture the fabric and leave a mark.

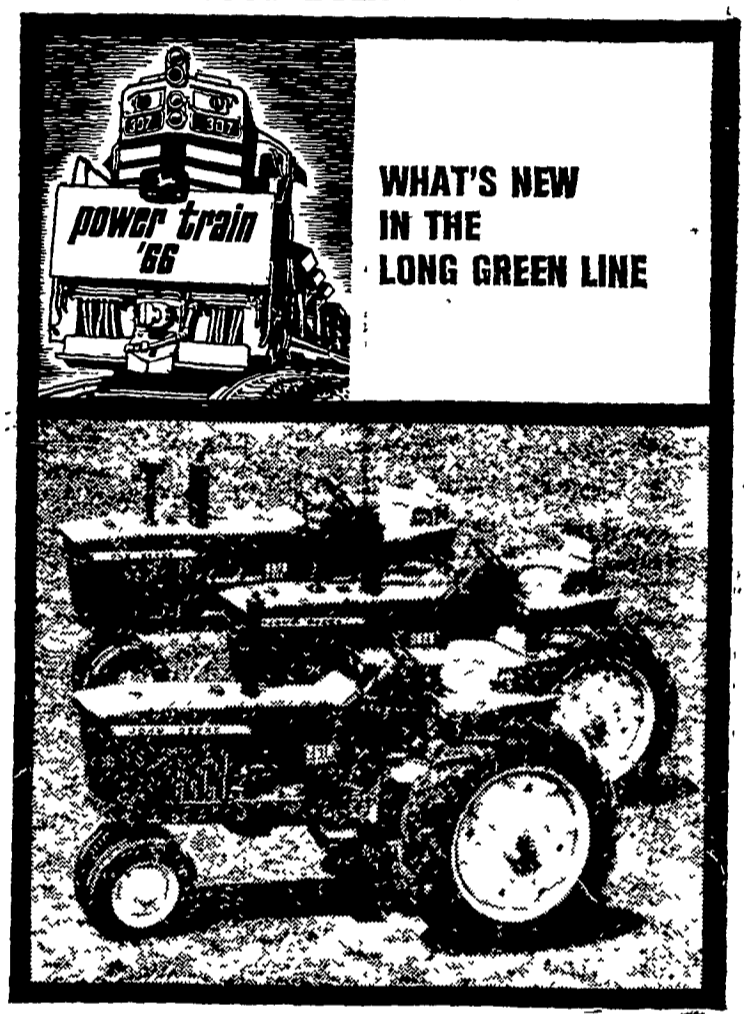
Use tape, binding, lining, and interfacing about the same weight as the fabric.

Sew with a medium-to-long machine stitch, and stitch at a steady even pace although it means going slower than usual.

Mark the fabric with clay chalk, tracing wheel, or dressmaker's carbon if you know the carbon will wash out.

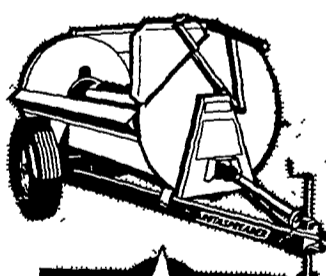
