CATTLE — Receipts 24,600 compared with 23,400 last week and 24,000 a year ago. Twelve market receipts for three day period 177,300 compared with 196,300 last week and 167,200 a year ago. Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers generally steady, instances 25 higher on Good to Low Choice under 1100 lbs Heifers strong to 25 higher. Cows 50-75 higher Bulls strong to 50 higher. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef steady to 50 lower Heifer beef generally steady Cow beef strong to 50 higher
