(Continued from Page 1) conservation districts. Among goals set for next year were:

1—125 new district agricultural cooperators; 3 non-agricultural district communities.

2—Contact 300 farms applying practices to review their needs for new practices.

3—SCS to work with 115 new basic agricultural plans and with 3 non-agricultural plans.

4—Farmers Home Administration will plan to work with 45 family farms and one

rural community on loan services; new authority will include one senior citizens' complex.

5—The Department of Forest & Waters plans to plant 100,000 trees; mark 100 acres of timber for cutting; and work 25 acres of timber stand improvement.

The 1966 proposed district budget in the amount of \$1,365 was approximately the same as for the current year, but it included an expenditure for clerical help for the district.

In other business discussed at the directors' meeting, it was decided to hold meetings with township supervisors; complete work on the Project 566 flood control plan for Manheim area; hold future meetings in facilities of the cooperating agencies rather than at the County Court House.

Wayne Maresch submitted the name of one new co-operator, Donald L. Hershey of Manheim R2, and 2 plans for cancellations resulting from farm sales. These were unanimously approved by the directors.

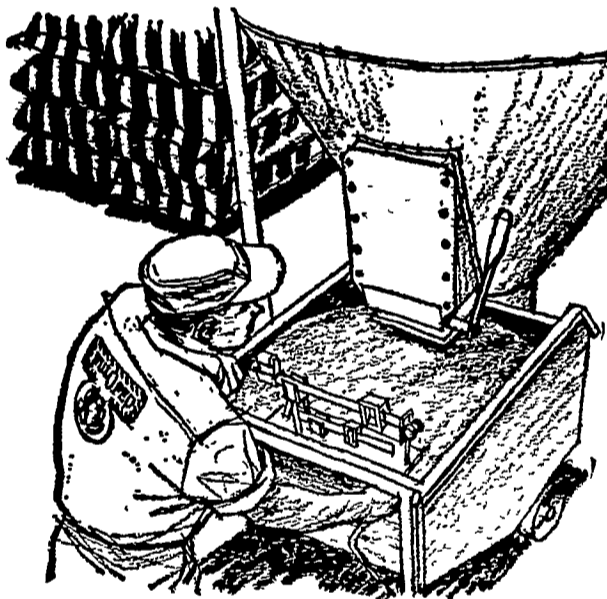
