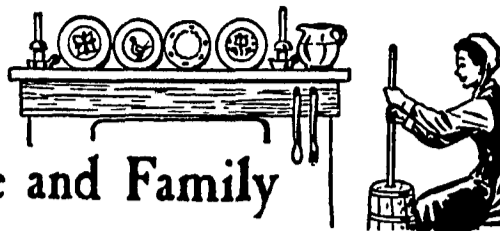

Some Figure-Saving Food Hints for the Holidays

Enjoy any party food that is served but limit the size of your selection. You might try an open-faced sandwich with thin slices of meat and a small amount of dressing.

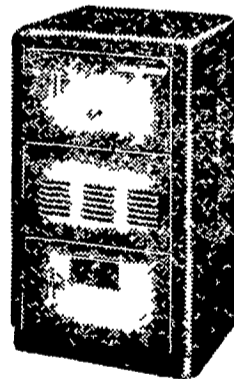
