Prices for light hens held unchanged. Offerings barely adequate for good buying interest. Supplies of heavy hens adequate for an only fair demand. Sentiment stronger. Prices paid @farms: Light hens 7½-9 mostly 8-8½c, Heavy hens 15-16 mostly 15½-16c.

TURKEYS

Trading generally quiet. Supplies well cleared on heavy hens and small breeds; adequate to barely adequate on heavy toms. Occasional buying interest at 28c for heavy hens remained unfilled. Prices paid at farms, all classes, too few sales to report prices.

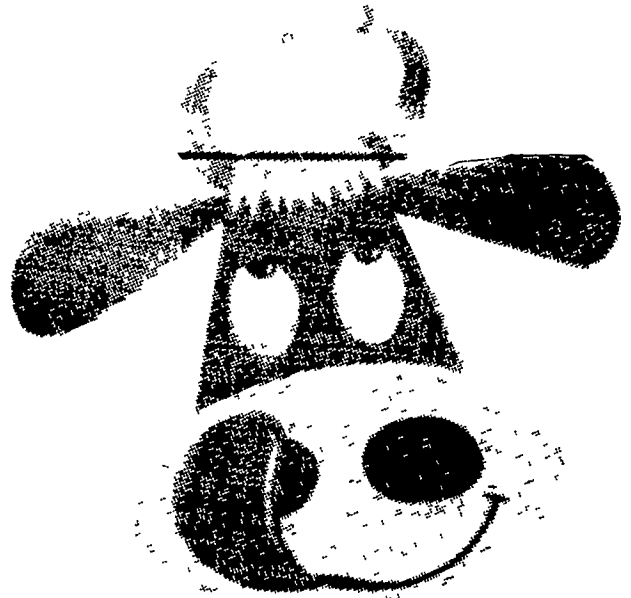
