CATTLE — Receipts 24,200 compared with 21,800 last week and 26,700 a year ago. Twelve market receipts 196,100 compared with 163,300 last week and 239,800 a year ago. Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers closed steady to 25 lower, instances 50 lower early in period. Heifers steady to 25 lower. Cows strong to 50 higher. Bulls steady to 50 higher but bulk steady to strong. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef steady to 50 lower. Heifer beef steady cow beef very uneven. Commercial steady to 50 lower.

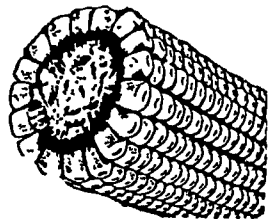
