

Prices To Farmers Up For Third Month

HARRISBURG — Average prices received by Pennsylvania farmers rose for the third consecutive month in November, mainly because of advances in hogs, eggs, grain and milk, according to the State Crop Reporting Service.

The mid-November average was 2 percent higher than in October and 4 percent

above mid-November prices last year.

Prices received by farmers throughout the nation in November were 6 percent higher than in November 1964. Prices paid by farmers for commodities and services were up 3 percent from a year earlier.

November hog quotations, \$24.20 per hundredweight, were the highest in 18 years. While hog prices were advancing 40 cents

per cwt. from October, other livestock prices tapered off with steers and heifers down 90 cents per cwt.

November milk prices averaged \$5.20 per cwt., up five cents from a month earlier. Eggs advanced two cents a dozen to 41 cents. Broilers and roasters were up fractionally, while turkey prices went up one cent a pound.

Modest gains were scored in most grain prices, but corn dipped four cents a bushel from the mid-October average. The November quotation of \$1.26 a bushel was three cents lower than a year earlier.

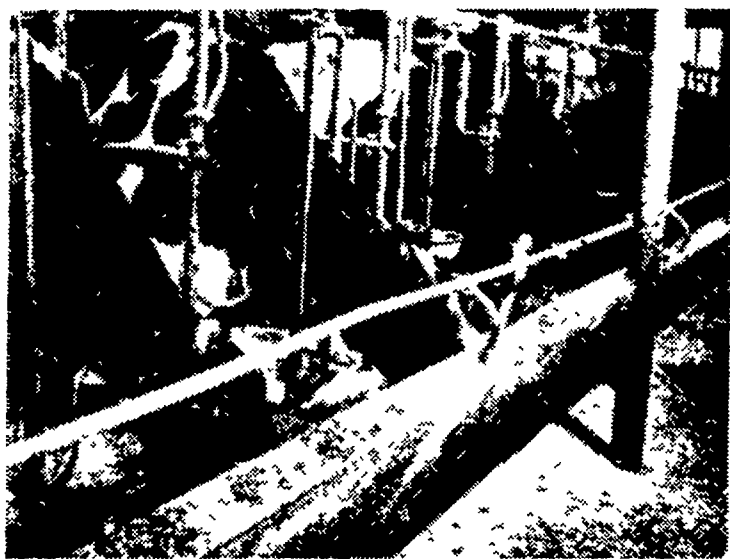

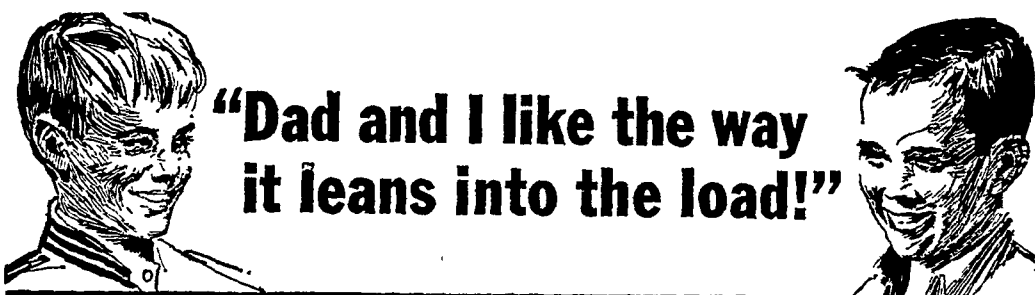

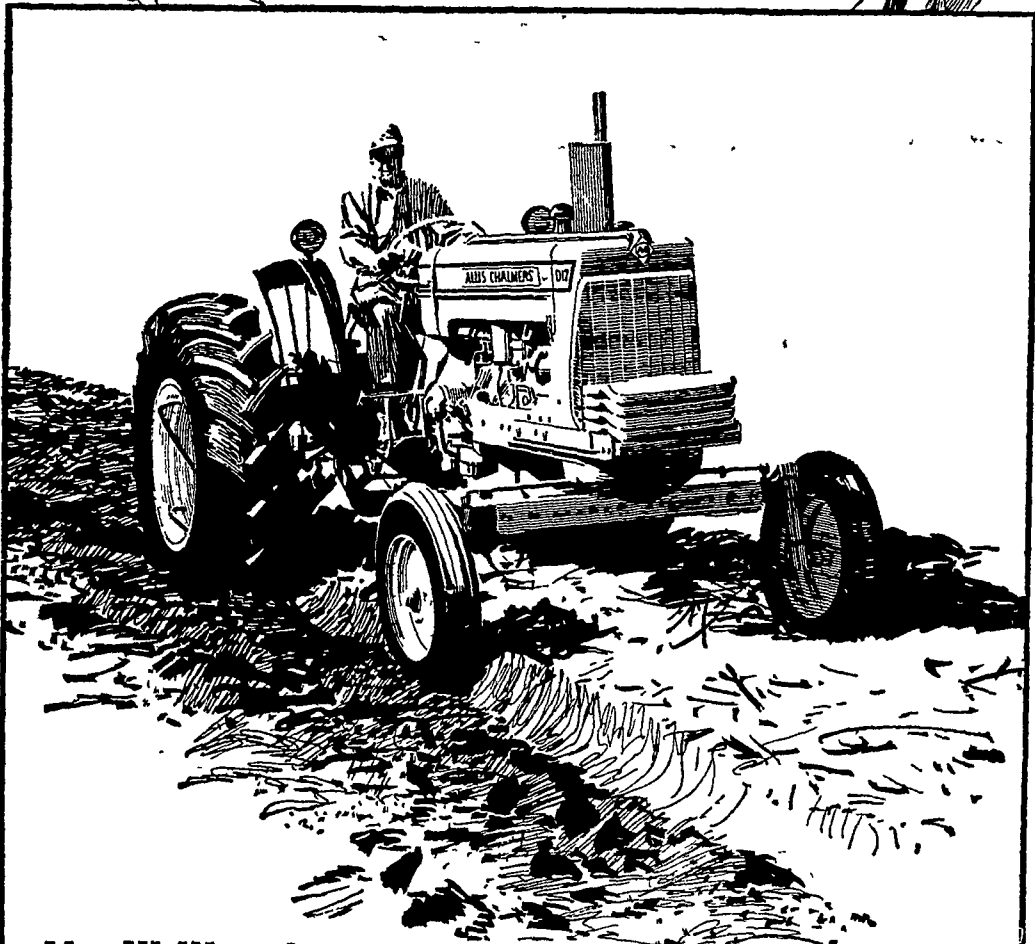
