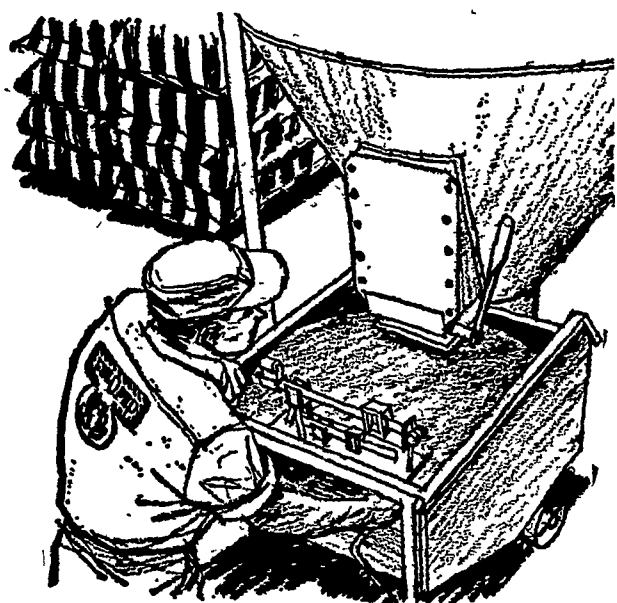
males, and works with his father and brothers on the family's 300-acre farm. Jim is the 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Milton Esbenshade.

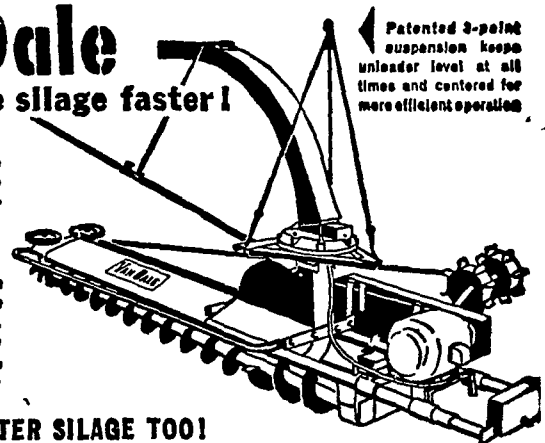

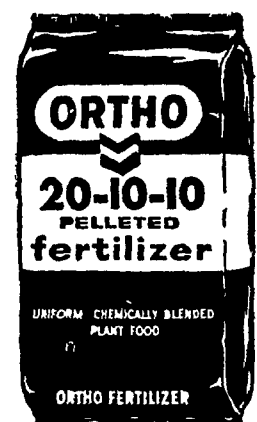
