



FLAGS MARK EXTRA CORN PLANTS HE'S ADDED PAST 5 YEARS

Arthur Paulsmeyer, of Chamois, Missouri, has increased his plant population 5,000 plants per acre in 5 years. That's one added plant in every 35 inches of row—we've marked these added plants with flags.

He grows 260 acres of corn. In dry 1964, he had

some fields which averaged 150 bushels per acre—others which sagged to 80—yet figured the high plant population didn't hurt him. His goal is no 125 bushels per acre—thinks he can go to 15 eventually. His plant population is 18-20,000—thinks he can go to 24,000 in time.
