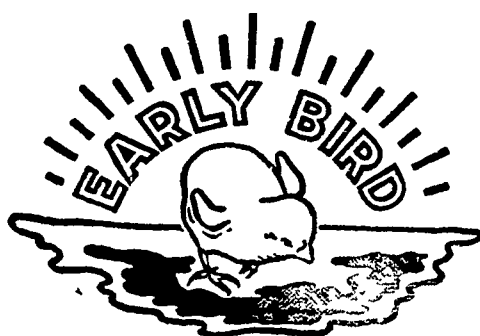

The next county meeting was set for February 1, 1966.



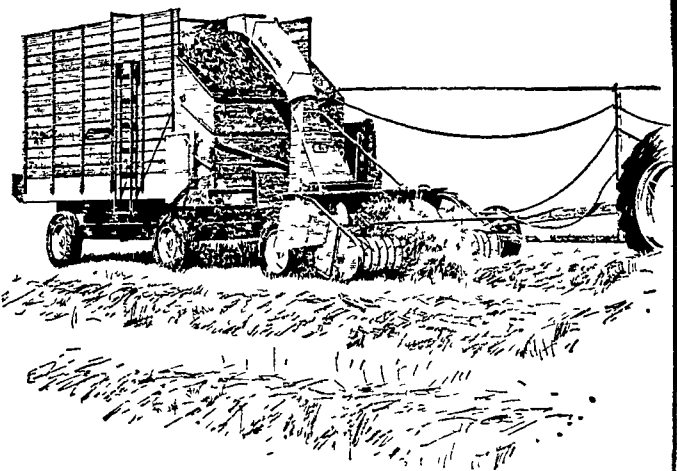
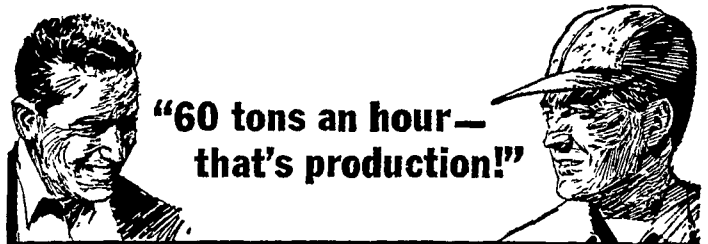
