Mixtures and Fiber Blends

A fiber mixture is achieved after spinning by twisting together two or more strands of spun yarn or continuous filament. A fabric mixture may be made up of a mixture of yarns, different single yarns laid side by side, or warp yarns of one fiber and filling yarns of another. Fiber blending is done before spinning a yarn from exact proportions of different fibers. A blend may be made up of manmade and natural fibers, combinations of manmade fibers, or combinations of natural fibers.

The washability of any fabric woven from mixed or blended yarns depends upon the fibers involved and/or on the finish applied to the fabric after weaving.
