### USDA Releases New Agr. Statistics Book

A fact-filled yearbook that pinpoints recent developments in American agriculture, "Agricultural Statistics, 1965" was released this week by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The publication contains items of interest to farmers and to others associated with agriculture. The 11 chapters, and more than 600 pages, provide tables and other information on agricultural production and prices, supplies, costs, income and related subjects. The handbook also carries information on land use, farm ownership, farm workers and food consumption. There are statistics on weather, freight rates, refrigerated warehouse storage, fisheries, forestry, world crops and foreign trade.

New tables in this issue include information about the wheat and feed grain programs showing acreage, diverted and payments earned by States, forest land showing area and ownership, volume of sawtimber, timber cut and timber growth and mortality, and exports of grains under specified government programs.

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. — A nine-year-old registered Holstein cow Roaring Maples Lucifer Faith owned by Roy H. & Ruth H. Book, Ronks, has completed a lactation of 15,697 lbs. milk, 632 lbs. butterfat and 1,306 lbs. solids-not-fat in 305 days.

Under Holstein-Friesian Association of America's production testing, the solids-not-fat portion of milk is being recorded as part of each cow's lactation credits. SNF are those nutrients such as protein, lactose and minerals found below the creamline of milk.
