GARDEN SPOT FARM MECH. CLASS TO MEET

The Garden Spot Young Farmer Class will hold its Farm Mechanization meeting on Monday, February 7, at 7:29 p.m. in the Agriculture Department of Garden Spot High School.

Larry Cluck, Extension Agricultural Engineer, Pennsylvania State University, will discuss Mechanical Handling of Manures including liquid manure systems and the economics in their use.

Penn State Short Courses Offered

The Grassland and Forage Short Course for 1966 will be held from February 21 to 24 on the main campus of Penn State University.

Each half day will be highlighted with special topics, with four to six speakers on each major area. The topics to be discussed include: Soils and Soil Fertility; Crop Establishment and Production; Crop Management; Pasture, Silage, Hay Production and Management; Forage Crop Mechanization and Storage; Forage Crop Utilization.

Twenty-five different instructors will take part in this short course.

A Farm Management Short Course will be offered on the main campus on March 7 and 8. The course will center around using the electronic computer in the farm decision-making process. The records of a Mifflin County dairy farmer, who is using the data processing service, will be studied in the course.

Any individual 16 years of age or older is eligible to enroll. The registration fee is \$10 for Pennsylvania residents, \$15 for non-residents.

GRAIN IN STORAGE IN PA. UP 10 PERCENT

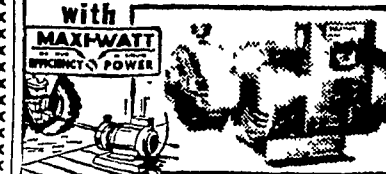
Pennsylvania had 10 percent more grain in storage on January 1, 1966, than it had a year earlier, according to the State Crop Reporting Service.

Corn accounted for most of the advance with 47.3 million bushels in storage, an increase of 23 percent. Barley stocks were up 282,000 bushels, or about 6 percent.

Wheat stocks were estimated at 10 million bushels, down 12 percent from a year earlier. Oats were down 2 percent, with January 1 holdings estimated at 17 million bushels.

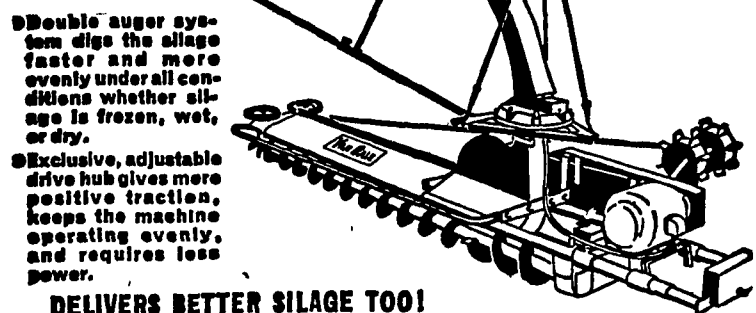
