### Advisory Committee Calls For Increased Tobacco Research

Greater emphasis on research to increase labor productivity and reduce costs in all phases of tobacco production was strongly recommended by the Tobacco Research Advisory Committee of the U.S. Department of Agriculture recently.

Reduction in the costs of tobacco production is necessary to bring prices down to a level that will restore the competitive position of U.S. tobacco in world markets and increase income to farmers, the committee said.

Increased mechanization and other labor-saving developments in tobacco planting, growing, harvesting, and marketing were recommended.

The committee also urged the development of tobacco varieties that will produce uniform stands and growth,

U.S. Department of Agriculture research to develop safe, efficient pest control methods include using radio waves to disinfect stored grain, foodstuffs, and wood; infrared energy to control rice weevils and mosquitoes; and ultraviolet radiant energy to attract and destroy tobacco hornworm and budworms.

and leaves that ripen uniformly on the stalk without deteriorating in quality.

Also in the area of farm research, the committee recommended increased research on the effects of production practices including soil types and management, fertilization, sucker control, ripeness at harvest, and curing and preparation for market.

In the area of utilization research, the committee recommended further studies on the relationship of cigarette and cigar smoke to the chemical composition of tobacco.
