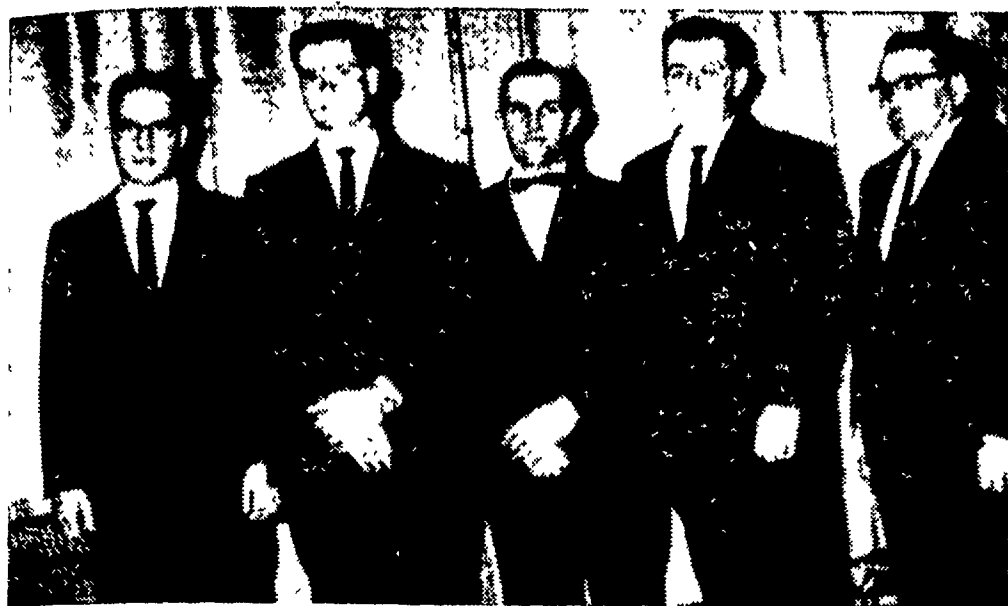


FARMERS WIN AWARDS AT GARDEN SPOT YFA BANQUET

Quotas Okayed For Two Cigar Tobacco Types

Final returns from two referenda held Feb. 10 show that growers have approved marketing quotas for 1966, 1967 and 1968 crops of (1) cigar binder (types 51 and 52), and (2) cigar filler and binder (types 42, 43, 44, 53, 54 and 55) tobacco. The U. S. Department of Agriculture announced this week.

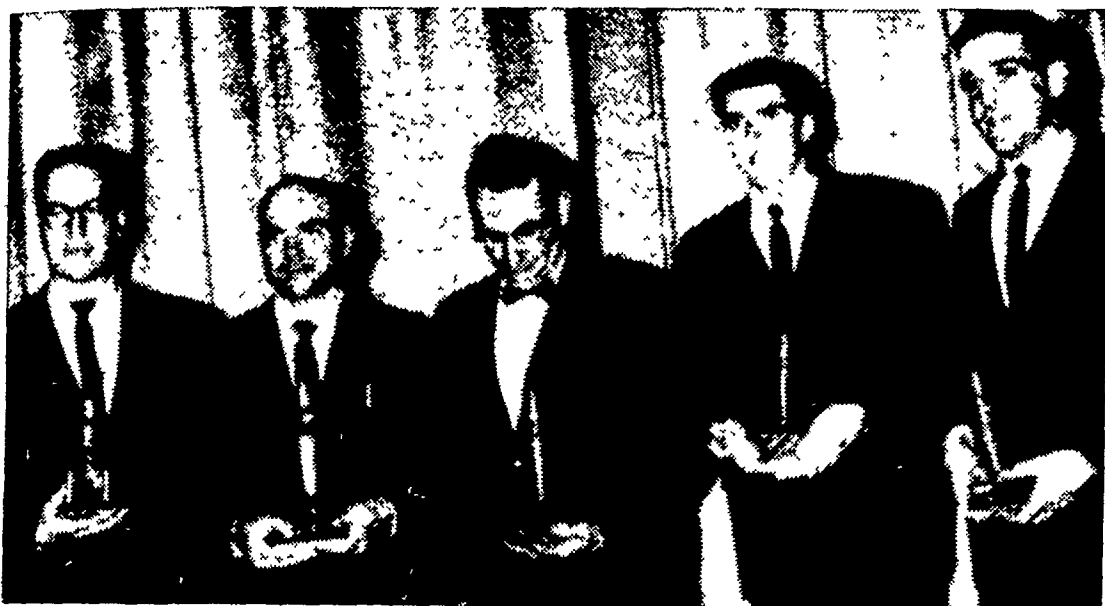
These final returns show 96.6 percent of the 354 votes counted approved quotas on cigar-binder tobacco. Quotas on cigar-filler and binder tobacco were approved by 91.3 percent of the 3,659 votes counted.

Since at least two-thirds of those voting in each referendum approved quotas, quotas will be continued in effect on each of these two kinds of tobacco.

Under the quota program, tobacco produced in excess of the farm allotment will be subject to a marketing penalty of 75 percent of the average market price for the previous marketing year. Producers will be available on cigar filler and binder tobacco produced during the 1966, 1967 and 1968 crop years in accordance with legislation.

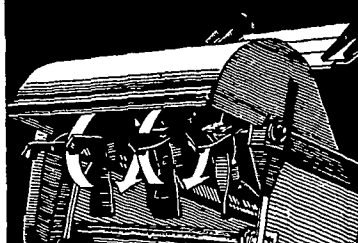

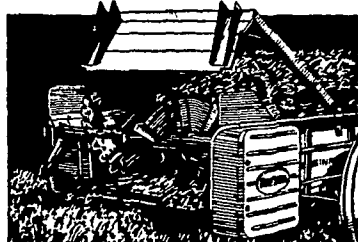

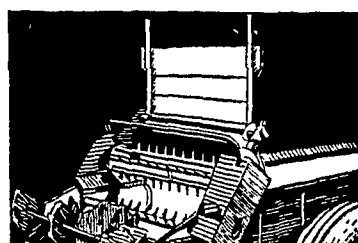
