LIVE HENS
Prices for light hens 1/4-1/2c higher. Offerings short. Buying interest good with bids @ 93-10c declined. In instances, processing activity curtailed due to light supplies. Some inquiry developed for hens to be purchased as replacement flocks. Trading increased on heavy hens. Demand good. Offerings not as short, but remain barely adequate in most instances. Few ♀s priced @ 35c on a straight run basis. Prices paid at farms: Hens, Light Type 9-10 1/4, mostly 9 1/2-10; Heavy 23-25, mostly 23-24c.

TURKEYS
Demand fair, especially for Hebrew Holy Day requirements. Supplies light. Limited sales of heavy 12-13# hens were priced at 33c.

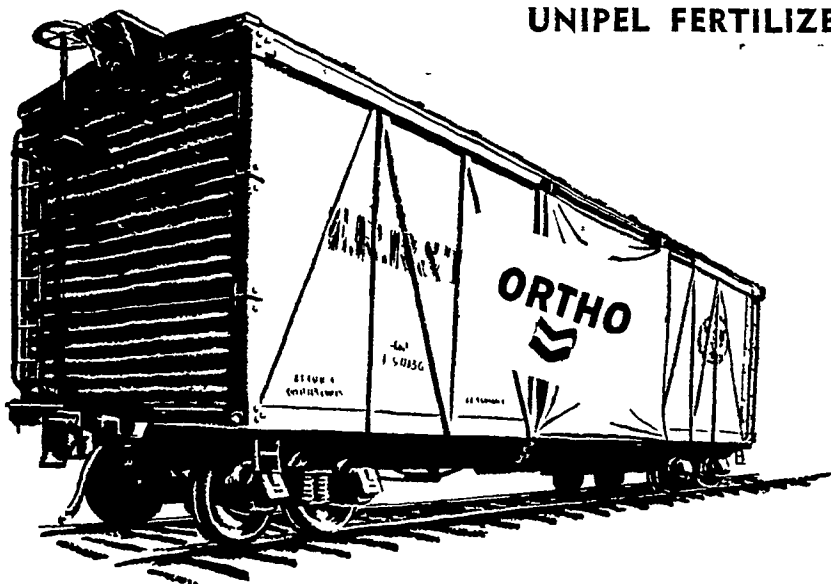
