Diversion Programs Have Insurance Aid Built-In, ASCS Says


Farmers taking part in the diversion programs have built-in insulance against natural disaster, according to the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee.

Last year, when flood, drought, and other such natural disasters prevented farmers from carrying out their signed-up program intentions, special legislation was enacted to enable participants to quality for the program payments, and thus meet the emergency situation. Because of this experience, similar provisions were included in the omnibus Food and Agriculture Act of 1965, enacted last November.

Theretore, farmers who sign up to take part in the 1966 wheat and teed grain programs may still quality for feed grain plice-support payments and wheat marketing certificates it the farmer files a special application at the ASCS county office and it can be determined that for production under the adjustment programs. However, the acreage would not qualify for the disaster benefits if it was subsequently devoted to any income-producing crop for harvest in 1966.
