you do to get penetration with some other materials. Another advantage is the time-saving aspect of methyl bromide."

Engle said the bed is covered with a sound piece of 4-mil thick plastic which remains in place for 48 hours after the liquid methyl bromide is put in. Then the cover can be removed for 24 hours, and because the material is so volatile, seeds can be safely sown without further delay.

"This is particularly helpful in the Spring when time is at a premium," Engle said.

He also reported that costs compare favorably with other chemicals, and are probably lower than with steam

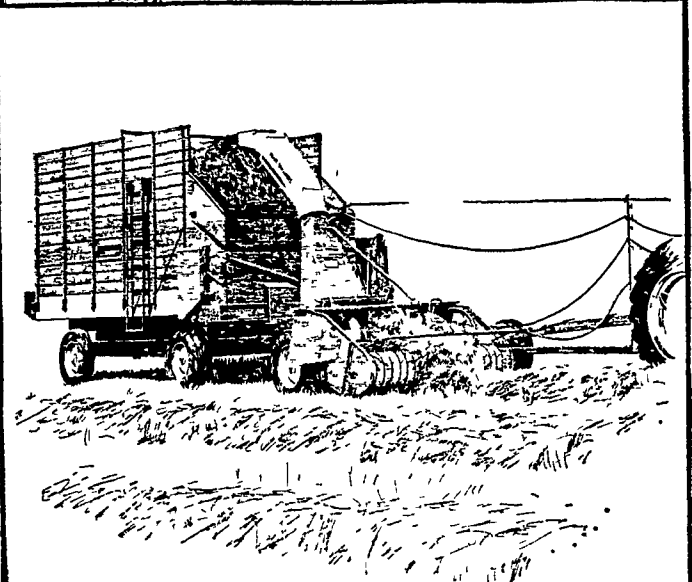
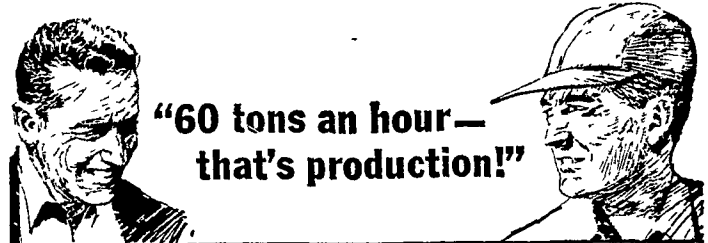
