 To make shells: Blend together graham cracker crumbs, butter or margarine and sugar. Divide mixture between 8 fluted paper baking cups set in 3-inch muffin pan cups. Press crumb mixture firmly against bottom and sides of cups with a small custard cup or small straight-sided glass. Refrigerate.

Look for a firm, close underweave for wear and durability.

Check towels for close, thick loops that will give quick drying.

Since comfort of a towel is important, choose towels of soft, medium-soft, or rough texture as you prefer.

Choose towels that won't pucker at either end and at the border, but will take laundering without puckering.

Be adventurous about color and design. Do your own color-scheming . . . it's one way to develop a sure touch in decorating.
