Hostesses were Mrs. Groff, Mrs. Charles Shank, Mrs. Warren Chapman and Mrs. Clinton Eby.

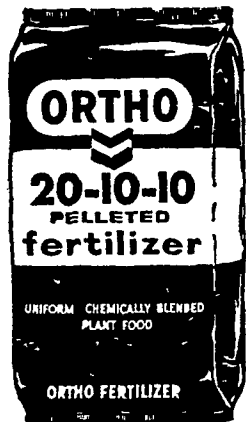
Next meeting will be held April 16 at the Musser Spring House.
