Connie Shatter, a junior at Manheim, was named Chapter Sweetheart for 1966 succeeding Julie Baker.

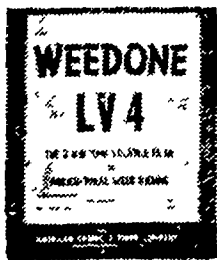
Outstanding chapter public speaker John Nissley, presented a talk on soil and water conservation called "Tops to Bottoms."
